# **Creekside Inn...Leroy...September 17**



This month our Rivers Run dining group will enjoy a lunch outing at Farmer's Creekside Inn overlooking Oatka creek on Friday, September 17. Outside patio lunch reservations will be made for 1:00 p.m. We hope many neighbors will plan to sample this beautiful setting and a tasty lunch with friends. Advance reservations to Marilyn no later than Tuesday, September 14.

The Creekside Inn offers a small, but well chosen luncheon menu. Options include a half dozen appetizers from soup to duck tacos to oysters and shrimp. Main course offerings focus on salads and sandwiches all done with fresh, local ingredients and special care. Prices range from \$10 to \$20 per person.

In addition to the menu, Creekside Inn offers a spectacular outside dining space overlooking one of the Oatka Creek waterfalls. The restaurant itself is housed in a beautiful, renovated historical building that runs along Main Street in LeRoy.

The drive to LeRoy will take about 45 minutes or less depending on your choice of thruway travel or the more leisurely country roads that offer glimpses of Scottsville, Caledonia-Mumford and more. Once in LeRoy, take a stroll down Main Street to check out the Jell-o Museum and some of the well kept, older homes that add to the charm of this small town.
